

Editorial

As well observed by Professor Jaime Nubiola, from Universidade de Navarra, Spain, who honors us by signing the jacket of this issue, **Cognitio** v. 10, n. 1 brings a harmonious blend of articles by Brazilian, American and European scholars. Its content, besides the scientific excellence assured by a strict submission process, reveals the fulfillment of a major directive of the project that guides the publication of this journal, namely, an opportunity for manifold theoretical lines, unfolding intertwined with pragmatism, and inviting the participation of specialists from major international centers of philosophical research.

Incidentally, as readers are aware, **Cognitio** has a history of international development for receiving submissions for most of the articles presented in the International Meetings on Pragmatism, which, in 2009, completed their 12th subsequent version, since 1998. **Cognitio** has also contributed greatly to disseminate the ceaseless work of the Center for Pragmatism Studies of the Pontifical Catholic University of São Paulo (PUC-SP), which constitutes, in effect, the hub around which studies, publications and other academic events occur. Recent statements by scholars from other international research centers reaffirm the gravitational importance that PUC-SP holds today in research on pragmatism. At the same time that it brings satisfaction for the well-deserved acknowledgment of a work that feeds on a proficuous dialogue with the academic community, this consideration naturally revigorates our responsibility in maintaining its course.

Notable in this issue of **Cognitio** are the logico-epistemological lineage of the texts by Chiappin-Leister and Pape, Segatto and Silveira, the classic questioning of meaning, in its nexus with pragmatism, contained in Liszka's and Rydenfelt's texts, reflections of an ontological nature on the notion of chance in the contributions from Skaggs and Salatiel, and the so infrequent presentations of Santayana and Emerson in the Coleman and Dilworth essays. A wide-ranging bill of fare of themes, meeting not only the profile of readers specifically focused on some of them, but also those who wish to breathe new airs of philosophical speculations beyond their specialties in the realm of pragmatism.

We sincerely hope that this issue will offer an advantageous contribution to all scholars in this field.
