The first *Readings of Hegel’s Logic* Meeting began in 2017, and this year we completed the reading of the *Doctrine of Being*.

During this meeting, we explored various aspects of *Hegel’s Logic*, from its ontological and epistemological implications to its applications in other areas of philosophical and scientific thought. The presentations and debates aim not only at explaining and interpreting the texts but also at constructive criticism and exploring their contemporary relevance.
